Notice of Nondiscrimination

La Crosse County

- ✓ **La Crosse County** is committed to ensuring that no person is excluded from, participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise subjected to discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, disability, sex, age, religion, income status or limited English proficiency (LEP) in any and all programs, activities or services administered by **La Crosse County** in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related nondiscrimination authorities.
- ✓ Any person who believes they've been aggrieved by any unlawful discriminatory practice may file a complaint with the **La Crosse County**.

¹ Title VI and ADA regulations require **La Crosse County** to inform customers and the public of their rights under Title VI and ADA regulations by posting a *Notice of Nondiscrimination*. The public notice must include:

- ✓ A statement of nondiscrimination;
- ✓ Information on how to request additional information about the agency's Title VI and ADA obligations, including information on how to file a complaint, the location of the complaint form, etc.;
- ✓ Information on how to request Title VI and ADA information in another language, if required.

The *Notice of Nondiscrimination* should be posted in the following locations: website, public areas of the agencies office, inside vehicles, rider guides/schedules and transit shelters/facilities
